The CBC level reports require a password to open, the statewide summary report does not.</p>

Following the directions to save the CISCSR and run the macro will result in the following list reports being created in MS. Excel:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Investigations not linked • Investigations not commenced • Investigations opened between 25 and 30 days • Investigations opened between 31 and 50 days • Investigations commenced but not submitted • Investigations commenced after 24 hours • Investigations with victims not seen • Investigations with victims not seen in 24 hours • Investigations awaiting supervisory review • Investigations awaiting 2nd Party Review • Investigations open 40+ days without a disposition having been submitted • Investigations open greater than 50 days • Investigations awaiting supervisory approval for closure • Investigations closed with Case Status open <p>All that is needed to run these macros is access to this report in FSFN and MS Excel. The macro is simple to install, no special programming or technical skills are necessary.</p>

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
